

Instructions and Suggestions for Registering for the 8th International Temperature Symposium

July 29, 2002

Conference Registration

The Adobe Acrobat file “7305ISA2002RegForm.pdf” contains all of the information that you need to register for the 8th International Temperature Symposium. However, the form is easily misread, so we suggest reading the points below carefully.

Items 1., 2., and 3. on the form are straightforward.

Item 4. allows you to become a member of ISA. The cost for ISA membership for one year is less than the extra charge to attend the conference as a non-member, so it is a financial advantage to become a member. For those people from developing countries the membership charge is reduced to \$33. Item 5.A. There are actually three conferences taking place simultaneously: the Temperature Symposium, the ISA Emerging Technologies Conference, and the ISA 2002 Technical Conference. There is no additional charge to register for all three, compared to the charge to register for just the Temperature Symposium. To register for all three check the following boxes in the “3-Day Conference” section:

1. a basic registration “ISA Member \$295” or “Non-member \$395”
2. a surcharge for the Temperature Symposium (\$100 surcharge without Proceedings, \$225 surcharge with Proceedings).

If you wish to obtain the Proceedings, remember that the cost of the Proceedings is not included in the basic registration fee.

Item 5.B. You do not need to select a box in Section 5.B. The fees in Section 5.A include admission to the Exhibition.

Item 5.C. This section includes an option for a Temperature Symposium banquet on Wednesday, October 23rd.

Housing

The Adobe Acrobat file “7301ISA2002HousingForm.pdf” contains the information needed to register for the conference hotels. The area near Michigan Avenue and the Navy Pier is downtown Chicago, and this area is recommended. The convention center itself is south of downtown, and ISA runs a free bus service between the downtown hotels and the conference site.
